If hexagram one or two shows up three, instead of two more throws is needed in this way: If two throws are identical the eyes of those decide which line is changing. If three throws are identical it is, for hexagram one and two, all lines are nine or all lines are six. And of course, if none of the three throws are identical those two hexagrams are unchanged.
